

The money-bit

- **Trip contribution and Gift Aid** To join us, you'll be asked to cover the cost of your trip, which is calculated using the previous year's volunteer numbers and the total cost of the campaign. We build in an assumption of being able to claim Gift Aid on 60% of all contributions. We rely on this to cover any cost variations and to keep the charity running.
- **Building project** We also ask you to fundraise for more than just the trip contribution to support building costs and help pay for materials and local labour. 100% of any extra funding goes straight to the project.
 - **In-country partners** Volunteers often want to support our partners in-country, especially once they've returned. You can do this through our UK office. We retain Gift Aid to support running costs, and we kindly ask you to consider donating 6% of your gift towards this if there is no Gift Aid.

Mission Direct and Pastor Sara's Serve Cambodia have built three villages in the country's capital city area in and around Phnom Penh since our partnership began in 2007. We are moving our efforts to the remote quieter rural community in the northern province of Preah Vihear.

The project

Mission Direct continues to partner with Serve Cambodia and the Fellowship of Hope (FOH) Church network in Cambodia, but our focus is moving from Phnom Penh to a remote rural community in the northern province of Preah Vihear. Our partners want to build a school for a village where there is currently no school and the children have not been educated. Our partners Mr Meng Oum and his wife Sreylin, along with their young daughter Emma, have made the sacrificial move to Preah Vihear to start an outdoor school for 60 village children. This is an exciting new project which will benefit a particularly poor community.

Mission Direct has worked in the region in nearby Severet but this community is new to us! In 2024 we are excited to bless the school that is grades 1-6 with a toilet block and kitchen/dining facility.

Mornings: The building project will be to build the Arroyo De Lechez school a toilet block of 2 toilets and a room with kitchen and dining facilities to provide for the 28 pupils and 3 teachers. Toilets provide a place of dignity and privacy for both teachers and puplis.

Afternoon: You will participate in a range of ministry visits to feeding programmes, children's centres, orphanage for disabled children, among others.

The project

Mornings: Work with our partners in Narok to build more accommodation for the girls, which will also free up some of the space currently being used to house girls for a revenue-creating sewing project. Be warned, these girls might steal something from you – your heart.

Afternoon: Support community projects, such as a school for disabled children providing warmth and security for the sometimes forgotten.

Rest and relaxation

We can't take you to Kenya without going on safari – and not just any safari! Visit the Maasai Mara game park – one of the finest in the world – and experience awe-inspiring wildlife.



Giving the gift of education

Education is the main focus of our work in Malawi. In 2019, we started to help Starfish Malawi build a primary school in the village of Moyo, 20 minutes from the shores of Lake Malawi. Previously, local children had needed to walk an eight-mile round trip each day to go to the nearest school.

Afternoon: Support local community projects – including the experience of building a new brick home for a family.

Round off your trip with a two night stay in Murchison Falls National Park, where a game drive and trip on the Nile gives you the chance to see elephants, giraffes, and other wildlife.

The project In 2024, Mission Dir

In 2024, Mission Direct will be working at a secondary school in Rukungiri with the primary aim of constructing a dormitory specifically for girls who are in desperate need of accommodation and a place with better sanitation and hygiene.

Mornings: You will be working on building new school facilities.

Afternoon: Support local community projects, such as Chilli Children, Mosaic Vision Ministries, and Our Fathers House Ministries



Street life in Zambia is a reality for many girls in Lusaka. A large proportion are forced to resort to prostitution - a dangerous lifestyle in a city where HIV is prevalent. Most have limited access to education, and no hope of securing themselves a brighter future.

The project

We will be working at community schools in the shanty towns, where unemployment is high and many children struggle to attend school. We are building much-needed classrooms and toilet facilities. These new facilities will help to provide an education for many orphans and vulnerable children, who otherwise may not be able to attend school.

Capital city

Afternoon: Meet our local partners who work amongst the disadvantaged and marginalised people in Lusaka. Spend the afternoon on a street visit with the Footprints team, or spend the day at Chisomo - a drop-in centre for children from the street.

Every child deserves a chance

This is a non-building team where we will be dedicating most of our time on outreach with one of our partners, Footprints, a charity working with street children. The Footprints team make regular visits to various zones around Lusaka where vulnerable children who have found themselves living on the streets for a variety of reasons congregate. There are two categories of children who can be found on the street, those who come to

work and socialise during the day but have some form of home they return to at night and those children who live on the street permanently. We are also finding more and more girls some with babies on the street.

Footprint's mission is to engage regularly with the children forming friendship and trust and listening to their stories and problems. The team are then able to support the child and work through their issues with the eventual goal of re-integrating them with their families where appropriate or found a safe house to provide shelter from the dangers of the street and receive support and care and an opportunity to get back in to school or receive skills training.



Why we're here

Enabling change, one little life at a time...

As part of your mission, you'll get to experience other local community-run projects in-country. Whilst the main focus is our building campaign, these afternoon visits have just as much impact on the community as they do on us visiting - as this Rukungiri team recently found out...



Visiting local projects with The Chilli Children Trust, the team entered a compound they assumed was empty. Approaching a locked house, they heard a small whimper - Esther.

In a dark, filthy room on a concrete floor, covered in her own excrement, they found Esther - a young girl living with hydrocephalus and spina bifida. She hadn't eaten that day. Her mother worked all day and her father had abandoned her. This was Esther's life. Day after day. Alone, dirty and hungry. One cannot even describe the scene adequately to explain the horror of this girl's daily existence.



Through generous donations, £2000 was raised for Esther within two days. Praise God!

Immediately, arrangements were made for Esther (aged 14) to begin school for the first time in her life. Within a couple of months, she was taken by her mother to board at a special school in the east of Uganda.



Visiting Esther some months later, she is clean, dressed and interacting with her family. We even met Esther's father for the first time, who previously refused to acknowledge her, or us.

Through practical action from people just like you, Esther is now at school. She is happy. She is loved.

This is why we are here. To change, and be changed...
